Dr. Kris Poduska, Associate Professor Department of Physics and Physical Oceanography Memorial University

Archaeology makes extensive use of scientific analyses that are applied to materials collected from ancient sites. It's well known that radioactive isotopes of carbon can be used to determine the age of many materials, but I will demonstrate that physics tools can offer this and much more. As an example, I will describe how these analyses reveal valuable insights on the technologies developed by Neolithic peoples in the Near East as they were on the brink of discovering pottery.
